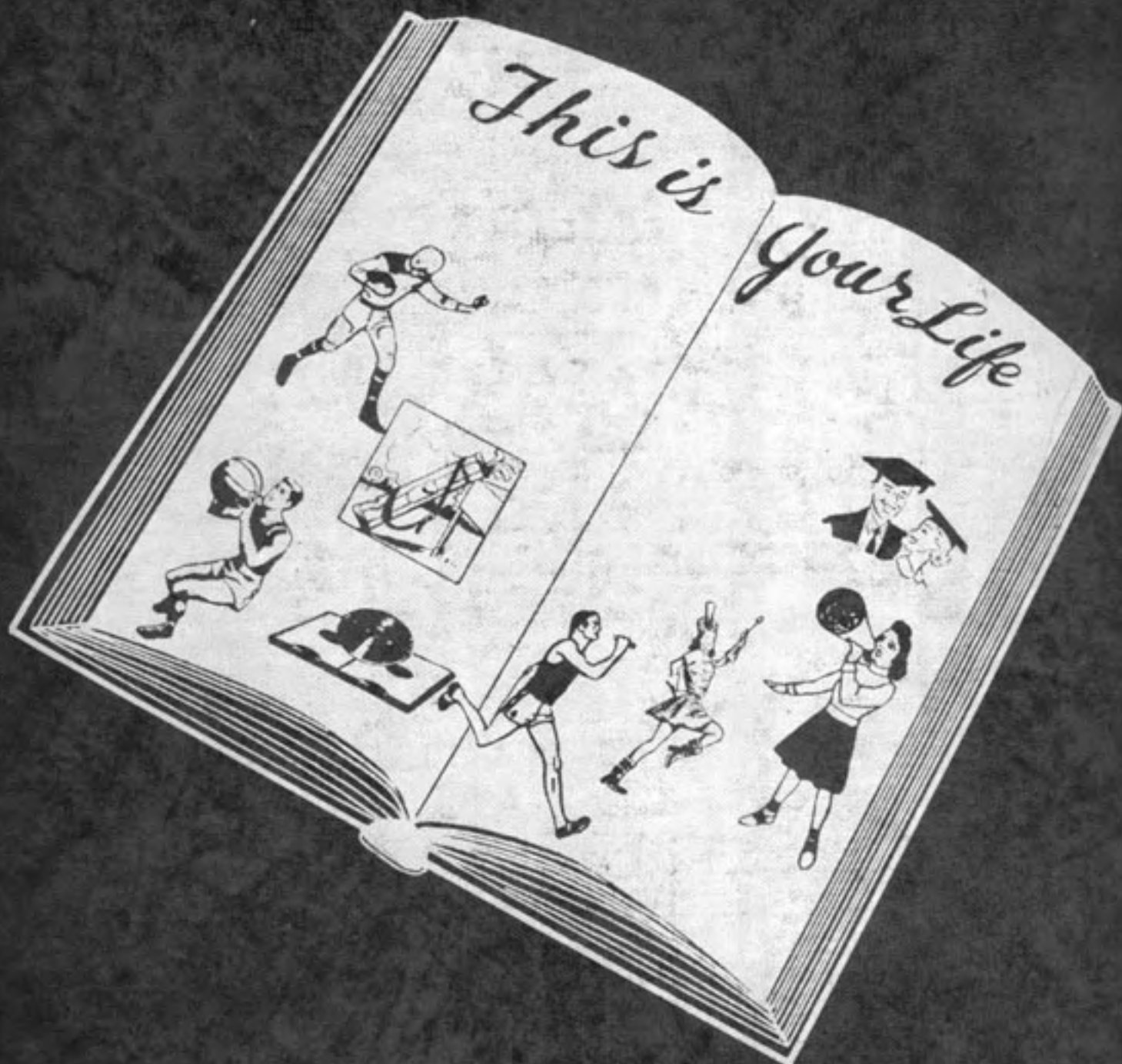

FOREWORD

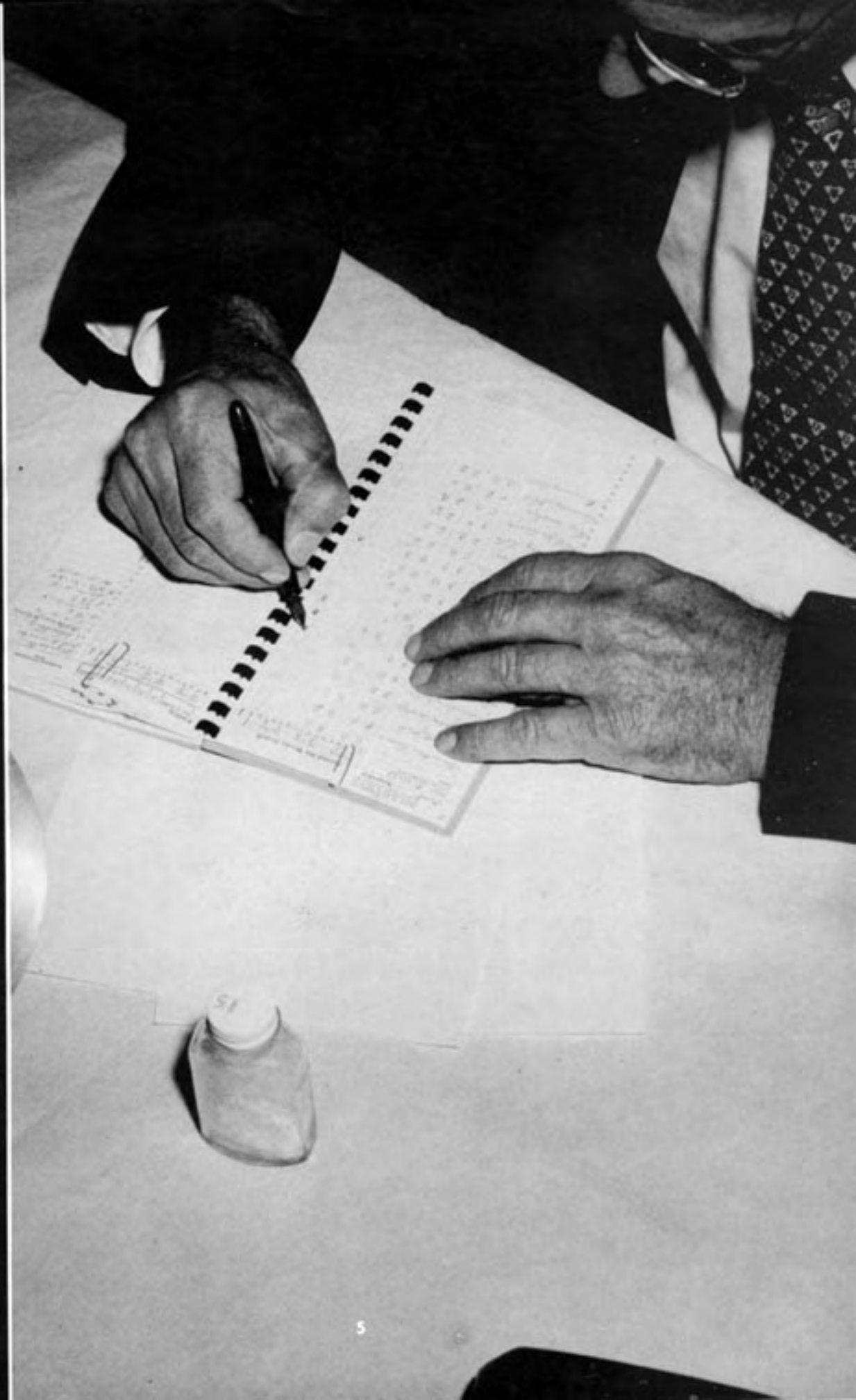

Pep rallies were held during the school day, before each game, and also before the Homecoming, and the traditional Paola game.

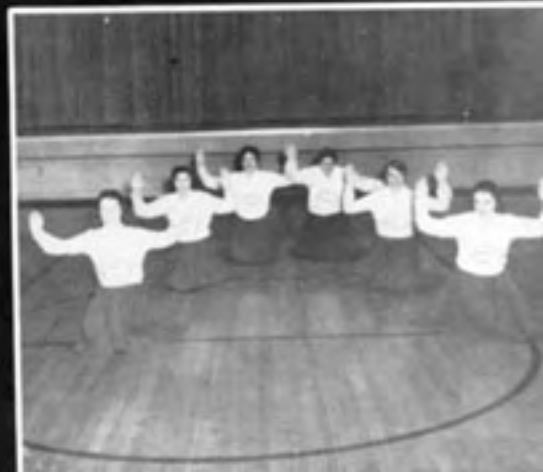

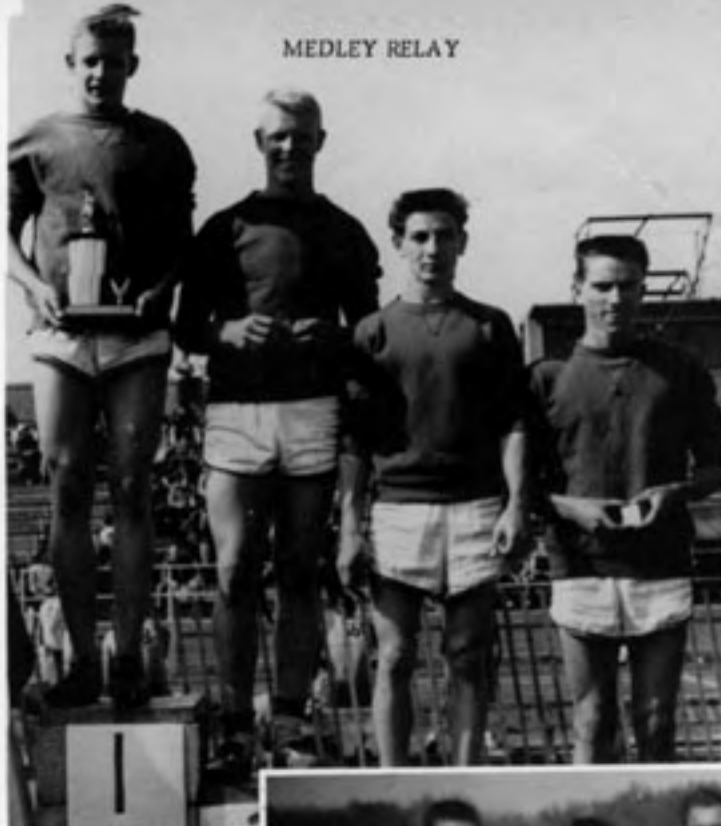
