

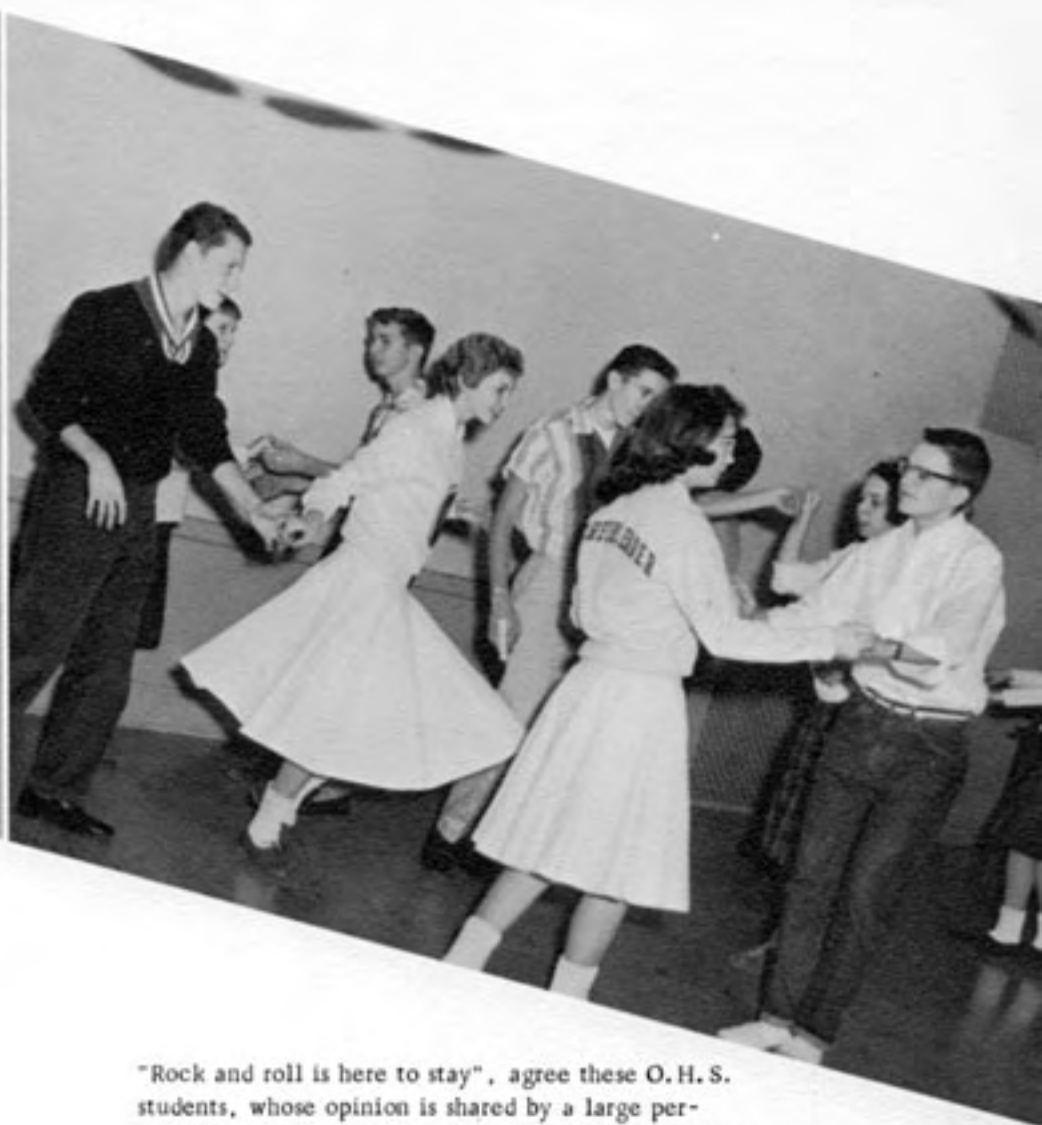

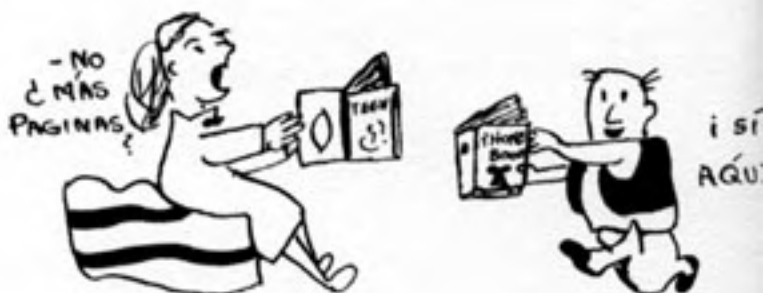

Spanish can lay a good foundation for further study and an understanding of other peoples' language and customs.



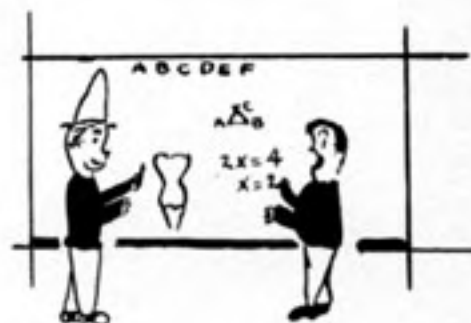
